

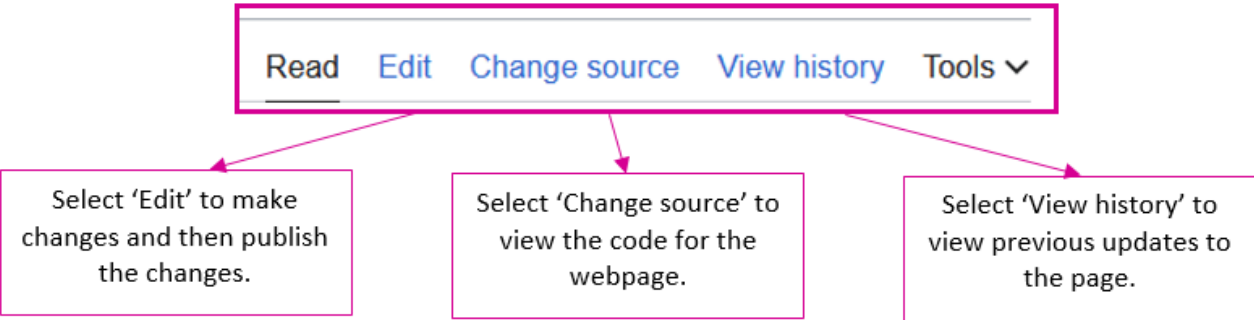

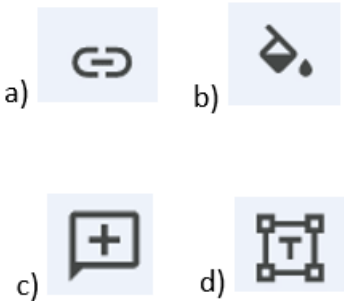
Key learning

Vocabulary

five pillars	The five guiding principles of Wikipedia, which is an online encyclopedia.
hyperlinks	Text or images that are turned into clickable buttons as a link to another page, section or website.
internet	Global network connecting computers and local networks using automated switches, routers and fibre-optic, copper-wire and radio connections.
wiki	A website that allows creation and editing on interlinked webpages, often created collaboratively by many people.
Wikipedia	An online encyclopedia edited by its users.

Keeping safe

S - Safe: Never share your name, address, or passwords with people you don't know.

M - Meeting: Never meet up with someone you met online.

A - Accepting: Be careful with what you click. Don't open messages or pictures from people you don't know.

R - Reliable: Not everything on the internet is true. People can lie about who they are, so stick to websites you can trust.

T - Tell: If something online makes you feel worried or unhappy, tell a trusted adult like a teacher or a parent right
