- 1913:** Emily Davison's famous protest at the Epsom Derby horse race.
- 1928:** Equal voting: A new law says that **all** women in the UK can vote, just like men.
- 1955:** Rosa Parks refuses to give up her bus seat, which starts the **Montgomery Bus Boycott** and leads to changes in the law so people can sit where they want.

Vocabulary

Rights	Rules that make sure everyone is treated fairly and has what they need to be happy and safe.
Inequality	When things are not fair because some people are treated better than others, and aren’t treated equally.
Segregation	An unfair rule that kept people apart because of what they looked like.
Protest	When people gather together to show or say out loud that they think a rule is wrong and needs to change.
Justice	Making sure that everyone is treated in a fair way and that people follow the right rules.
