It is essential that this booklet comes in to school **every day**. It will be used by your child's teacher who will record important tips for you to help your child with their reading.

Reading records are free of charge but replacements cost £1. Please encourage your child to be responsible with them.

Homework

Each week, Yr4 children receive:

- 10 questions - linked to the learning from that week
- Spellings
- Times Tables practice
- Regular reading

Homework is set on a Friday and is usually due the following Wednesday. We encourage all homework to be completed; it allows children to independently practice the skills acquired during the school week, and so it strengthens their learning and builds confidence!

Rights Respecting School - we do not have class rules, but instead, we have a class charter which considers how we can ensure all children have access to their rights, for example the right of an education (Article 28.) Children know they should take part in lessons, try their hardest, listen carefully, respect others etc.

Attendance



	In <u>one week</u> child misses.....	In a <u>year</u> child misses.....	Over the seven years of <u>primary</u> <u>school</u> child misses...
100% attendance	No days	No days	No learning at all
90% attendance	Half a day	Almost four weeks	Over four terms
80% attendance	One day	Over seven weeks	One school year and two terms
70% attendance	One and a half days	Eleven weeks	More than two years
60% attendance	Two days	Over fifteen weeks	Two years and four terms
50% attendance	Two and a half days	Almost twenty weeks	Three and a half years

If you were to achieve 90% on a test, you would probably be very happy. However, if a child attends school only 90% of the time, they will have missed 4 weeks by the end of the school year!

It is very important that your child/ren come to school every day. However, if children are unwell, please ring the school office and leave a message with details of your child's absence. Please call on each day of your child's absence. If we are not given a reason for absence, your child/ren will receive an unauthorised absence mark.

Punctuality is also very important; if children arrive late, they may miss important information to support their learning and it can also cause upset, arriving after their peers.

If you do arrive late, you will need to go to the office and complete an online form. This is so we can monitor punctuality and support where necessary.
